UKCPIE Principal Shadowing Programme

- 19 UK Colleges and 21 Chinese Colleges have taken part in two phases of shadowing
- Each phase has included visits to China and UK, with structured workshops as well as more informal shadowing opportunities
- The intensive 21 day visits left Principals '*tired but happy*' after an '*unforgettable opportunity*'
- At the UK-China Principals Dialogue at the AoC conference, the Principals signed a joint statement reaffirming commitment to building mutually beneficial partnerships
- The AoC China Forum has been set up to support on-going work

UKCPIE Principal Shadowing Programme: Next steps


“All Colleges in this cohort are very keen to work together and develop links with their partner colleges...”

- Many colleges have signed MOUs to underpin future collaboration
- Each UK Principal has written a report under one of the themes:
 - college management and leadership
 - quality assurance
 - teacher/staff development and training
- The colleges have funding to undertake return visits to inform Start-Up partnership proposals
- A group of principals from the second phase are forming a consortium to take forward ideas around: Quality improvement, teacher training, national occupational standards and exchanges

International skills partnerships

- ***Pre-commercial, mutually beneficial*** partnerships facilitated and evaluated by the British Council
- ***Consortia*** of organisations in the UK and counterparts overseas
- ***Exchange of knowledge and expertise***
- ***Pilot innovative*** approaches to furthering ***skills development and employability***
- ***Impact*** on an individual, institutional and national level
